



Bee Education Letter of Understanding for Schools

This Bee Education Letter of Understanding (“Agreement”) is dated _____ and is between The Bee Cause Project, Inc., a Georgia non-profit corporation (“Bee Cause”) and _____ (the “School”).

BACKGROUND:

Bee Cause’s mission is to advocate for bees to ensure their survival. As part of this mission, Bee Cause provides educational assistance to schools to help students become aware of, understand, and appreciate bees. As part of these educational assistance activities, Bee Cause provides schools with grants and other support to implement educational bee programs and projects. Bee Cause is a charitable organization that offers grants to schools/educational organizations and also allows organizations to purchase custom Bee Cause observation hives through it’s non-grant program. This Letter of Understanding addresses the partnership between Bee Cause and organizations that want to participate in the grant and non-grant programs.

The School desires to participate in The Bee Cause program in implementing a bee program (the Hive), and Bee Cause desires to provide such assistance to the School, pursuant to the terms of this Agreement. The parties therefore agree:

1. Scope of Services

Bee Cause agrees to provide the Services indicated below, and the School and Bee Mentor (also referred to as Bee Keeper) agree that they are responsible for the Services indicated below. A party is responsible for a Service as indicated by a mark in that party’s column corresponding to the specified Service. All noted parties are responsible for a Service if a mark is placed in more than one column. The School is solely responsible for all expenses to install, implement, and maintain the project onsite. It is the School’s responsibility to arrange for program approval, program/bee management and bee sourcing with the Bee Mentor. These services should be documented in a separate agreement. In addition, the School will be responsible for any expenses to remove or end the bee program from the installed site. Bee Cause is not required to reimburse the School for such expenses.

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2. Ownership of Equipment Beehive

Bee Cause will provide the Hive at its expense as well as assist in finding a local beekeeper to source the bees for the School. Upon delivery, the Hive and Bees will remain the property of the School.

3. Costs The cost to participate (outside of the grant program) in The Bee Cause Project’s National Program is \$2,500. *Grant recipients are exempt from these costs.*

4. Insurance BeeCause and School shall each maintain during the term of this Agreement commercial general liability insurance coverage with a commercially reasonable insurance carrier.

If requested by either party, Bee Cause and School must furnish to the other appropriate evidence of such insurance coverage and, thereafter, immediately notify the School in the event that such insurance coverage is no longer in force.

The School determines whether the beekeeper is required to hold his/her own insurance policy or will be covered as a volunteer or contractor when tending to the Hive and the Bees on the School’s property.

5. Term and Termination This Agreement begins on the date of this Agreement as set forth in the introductory paragraph and shall automatically renew, unless either party gives 30 days notice of cancellation. Either Bee Cause or the School may terminate this Agreement, with or without cause or penalty, upon thirty (30) days written notice mailed or hand-delivered to the other, or immediately by mutual written agreement. Upon termination or non-renewal of this Agreement the Hive and Bees will remain the property of the School, unless, in the absence of a written agreement to the contrary, the Hive and Bees are Abandoned by the School.

6. Assignment of Liability To the extent permitted by law without waiver of any defenses, parties shall each be responsible for any liabilities, losses, claims, demands, costs (including without limitation outside attorneys' fees) and expenses (collectively, "Claims") arising as a result of the negligence or affirmative acts committed by their own employees, agents, contractors or others over whom they have control.

7. Entire Agreement This is the entire agreement between Bee Cause and the School, and any previous discussions, negotiations, understandings, arrangements, or agreements are hereby superseded and replaced. This Agreement may only be amended or modified by a written amendment signed by both Bee Cause and the School.

8. Severability If any part of this Agreement is determined to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable, the remaining parts of this Agreement will remain in full force and effect.
