Bees need water

Bees need water to heat and cool their hive. You can help the bees by putting out a shallow dish with fresh water and pebbles for bees to land on.



Did you know?

- Honey bees carry water in their 'honey sac,' an extra-long part of their esophagus.
- Native bees drink water but also need it for mud which they use to make nests.

Bees need food

Bees and other pollinators eat nectar and pollen which comes from flowers. Nectar is a sugary energy-boosting food source and is what honey bees use to make honey!

Seed Balls are a fun way to support pollinators by providing food sources.
